ISAIAH 61: 10 - end

he has covered me with the robe of righteousness,

as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland,

and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.

For as the earth brings forth its shoots,

and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up,

so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise

to spring up before all the nations.

PSALM 45: 10 - end

10 Hear, O daughter; consider and incline your ear; ♦. forget your own people and your father's house.

11 So shall the king have pleasure in your beauty; ◆

he is your lord, so do him honour.

12 The people of Tyre shall bring you gifts; the richest of the people shall seek your favour.

13 The king's daughter is all glorious within; ◆

her clothing is embroidered cloth of gold.
14 She shall be brought to the king in raiment of needlework; ◆ after her the virgins that are her companions.
